### **Vehicle Registration Year - January - December 2020**

The chart below can be used to determine if your vehicle would qualify for the optional high mileage.

<b>2013</b>	<b>115,000</b>
<b>2012</b>	<b>130,000</b>
<b>2011</b>	<b>145,000</b>
<b>2010</b>	<b>160,000</b>
<b>2009</b>	<b>175,000</b>
<b>2008</b>	<b>190,000</b>
<b>2007</b>	<b>190,000</b>
<b>2006</b>	<b>190,000</b>
<b>2005</b>	<b>Minimum</b>

- A. Cars and light trucks may appeal for high mileage.
- B. Light trucks must have a gross vehicle weight less than 11,000 pounds and a net vehicle weight less than 9,000 pounds to qualify for the high mileage deduction.
- C. All other vehicles will not qualify to appeal the assessment due to high mileage.
