## Statewide Primaries & Runoffs

### June 11

#### Pick your Primary

- The Democratic Party and the Republican Party are holding Primaries on **June 11**. You can vote in either Primary, but not both.
- Any runoffs will occur on June 25, if necessary.

#### Register by the Deadline

- You must register by **May 12** to vote in the Primaries and Runoffs.
- Mailed applications will be accepted if postmarked by **May 13**.
- Make sure your voter registration is current by checking your registration information at [scVOTES.gov](https://scVOTES.gov).
  - If you have moved from one county to another, you must register in your new county to be eligible to vote.
  - If you've moved within your county or changed your name recently, update your information before Election Day to help ensure a smoother voting experience.
- Educate yourself on the candidates and issues by checking your sample ballot at [scVOTES.gov](https://scVOTES.gov).
- Make sure you have one of the following Photo IDs: SC Driver's License, SC DMV ID Card, SC Voter Registration Card with Photo, Federal Military ID, or US Passport.
  - If you do not have one of the Photo IDs, make your voting experience fast and easy by getting a free one from the DMV or your county elections office.

### You're halfway there, now pick how you want to vote!

#### Vote Early

- Any voter can vote early at any early voting center in their county during the early voting period. Go to an early voting center in your county, present your Photo ID, and vote using the voting system like you would at your polling place on Election Day.
  - The early voting period for the Primaries starts on **Tuesday, May 28 and ends Friday, June 7**.
  - The early voting period for the Runoffs starts on **Wednesday, June 19 and ends Friday, June 21**.
  - Early voting centers are open **8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.** during the early voting period.

#### Vote Absentee

- Qualified voters can vote absentee by mail. An example of a qualified voter could be a person with a physical disability or someone who is age 65 or older.
  - To vote absentee by mail, get your application by contacting your county elections office.

#### Vote on Election Day

- Vote at your polling place on Election Day. Polls are open **7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.**

- **Don't forget to bring your Photo ID to the polling place.**
