#### Sheriff presents check for Honor Flight

Lexington County Sheriff James R. Metts and Lexington County Sheriff's Department Sgt. David L. Amick on Wednesday, July 28 presented a check in the amount of \$6,020 to Bill Dukes, chairman of Honor Flight South Carolina.

The check reflected proceeds from a motorcycle benefit run that Amick recently organized in order to raise money for Honor Flight, which provides airline and ground transportation for World War II military veterans to visit military memorials in Washington, D.C., Metts said. Nearly 100 motorcycle riders participated in the motorcycle benefit run.

Metts and Amick presented the check to Dukes during a quarterly Sheriff's Department awards ceremony. During the awards ceremony, Metts recognized Sgt. Robin Walters, Master Deputy Dana Catoe, Field Training Officer Scott Barber, Deputy Richard Jacob, Deputy Shaun Gause and Chapin Resident Deputy Donall Stoudemire for assisting Amick with the benefit run.

"As a military veteran, David Amick recognizes the importance of honoring persons who have defended America's freedoms in military combat," Metts said. "Honor Flight South Carolina enables military veterans who are living on fixed incomes to visit memorials that our nation has constructed in order to recognize the sacrifices that have been made by men and women who have served in our nation's armed forces."

Amick lives near Chapin and is a veteran of the U.S. Navy.


