World War ll Victory Medal

The World War II Victory Medal was established by an Act of Congress on 6 July 1945 (Public Law 135, 79th Congress) and promulgated by Section V, War Department Bulletin 12, 1945. The medal was designed by Thomas H. Jones and approved by the Secretary of War on 5 February 1946. Consequently, it did not transition from a ribbon to a full medal until after World War II had ended. The World War II Victory Medal was first issued as a service ribbon, referred to as the 'Victory Ribbon.''

The Congressional authorization for the medal specified that it was to be awarded to any member of the United States military, including members of the armed forces of the Government of the Philippine Islands, who served on active duty, or as a reservist, between 7 December 1941 and 2 September 1945.

On 8 August 1946, the separate Merchant Marine World War II Victory Medal was established for members of the United States Merchant Marine who served during World War II.

The World War II Victory Medal was awarded for service between 7 December 1941 and 31 December 1946, both dates inclusive, with no minimum time in service requirement. The National Personnel Records Center has reported some cases of service members receiving the award for only a few days of service. As hostilities during the Second World War ended on 2 September 1945, there may be cases of service members who had enlisted, entered officer candidate school, or had been a cadet or midshipman at the U.S. Military Academy, the U.S. Naval Academy or the U.S. Coast Guard Academy between 3 September 1945 and any date in 1946, receiving the medal without having been a Veteran of the period of active hostilities during the war; the reason for this late date is that President Harry S. Truman did not declare an official end to hostilities until the last day of 1946.

As every member of the United States Armed Forces who served from 7 December 1941 to 31 December 1946 was eligible for the medal, there were over twelve million eligible recipients, making the World War II Victory Medal the second most widely awarded military award of the United States, after the National Defense Service Medal.

The bronze medal is 1 ½ inches in width. The obverse is a figure of Liberation standing full length with head turned to Dexter looking to the dawn of a new day, right foot resting on a war god's helmet with the hilt of a broken sword in the right hand and the broken blade in the left hand, the inscription WORLD WAR II placed immediately below the center. On the reverse are inscriptions for the Four Freedoms: FREEDOM FROM FEAR AND WANT and FREEDOM OF SPEECH AND RELIGION separated by a palm branch, all within a circle composed of the words UNITED STATES OF AMERICA 1941 1945.

The suspension and service ribbon of the medal is $1 \frac{1}{6}$ inches wide and consists of the following stripes: $\frac{1}{6}$ inch double rainbow in juxtaposition (blues, greens, yellows, reds (center), yellows greens and blues); $\frac{1}{22}$ inch White 67101; center $\frac{1}{26}$ inch Old Glory Red 67156; $\frac{1}{22}$ inch White; and $\frac{1}{6}$ inch double rainbow in juxtaposition. The rainbow on each side of the ribbon is a miniature of the pattern used in the World War I Victory Medal.

Although the World War I Victory Medal included Clasps, the World War II Victory Medal did not. This was because Campaign medals were awarded instead.

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced that all World War II Veterans are now eligible for no-cost VA inpatient and outpatient health care.

Under this expansion, all WWII Veterans who served between Dec. 7, 1941, and Dec. 31, 1946, are now eligible for VA health care, regardless of their length of service or financial status. These Veterans will not have to pay inpatient or outpatient copays, enrollment fees, or monthly premiums.

VA is reaching out by phone and mail to encourage WWII Veterans who are not currently enrolled in VA care to apply today. Veterans who enroll may also keep their private providers, Medicare, and most other insurance to meet their health care needs.

"These members of Greatest Generation answered the call to serve when our nation – and the world – needed them most. Now, it's our job to serve them in every way that we can," said **VA under Secretary for Health, Dr. Shereef Elnahal**. "We are proud to provide worldclass, low- or no-cost health care to these heroes at VA, and we encourage all of them to enroll today."

All WWII Veterans are encouraged to enroll in VA health care – the best, most-affordable health care in America for Veterans. Veterans who are enrolled in VA health care are proven to have better health outcomes than non-enrolled Veterans, and VA hospitals have dramatically outperformed non-VA hospitals in overall quality ratings and patient satisfaction ratings. Veterans who were not approved for VA health care in the past due to income limits should apply again; income levels no longer apply due to this expansion. VA cannot automatically enroll these Veterans in health care; WWII Veterans must apply for VA health care if they are not currently enrolled.

While World War II Veterans will no longer have to pay inpatient or outpatient copays, they may still have to pay modest medication or urgent care or long-term care copayments in some cases, depending on their eligibility and service connection.

This expansion is made possible through the Joseph Maxwell Cleland and Robert Joseph Dole Memorial Veterans Benefits and Health Care Improvement Act of 2022 (Cleland-Dole Act), signed in December 2022.

Protecting your benefits

How to safely file for a claim

VA wants you to know there are some predatory companies, not recognized by VA, that are targeting you by offering to assist you with your VA benefit claim. These companies charge absurd fees or require you to pay a portion of your VA benefits. VA will never charge you to apply for the benefits you may be entitled to. If you think you're entitled to benefits, please review the following preventive measures to help guard against fraud and scams.

 Apply directly to your VA or your local VA county office. If you plan to file a claim, you may submit your claim in person at any regional office, county VA office, or online. The VA will help you gather the evidence you need to support your claim. There are no costs or hidden fees to file a claim for benefits.

- Be cautious of media advertisements from companies who provide information about the recent changes in law for toxic-exposure benefit claims and suggest Veterans can only obtain VA benefits with their help. These companies may not be recognized through the VA and may be trying to charge Veterans illegal fees. Use of the VA Office of General Counsel (OGC) Accreditation Search to confirm and validate the credentials of anyone offering claims assistance.
- Do not sign a contract agreeing to pay an unauthorized company a fee to help you with your VA claim. There are accredited Veterans Service Organizations, agents and attorneys who may assist you.
- Be cautious of companies claiming to be contacting you on behalf of the VA. Contact VA directly at 1-800-827-1000 if you are unsure about the authenticity of a message you've received.
- Review all documents thoroughly. Never sign a blank form for someone else to complete later. They should always review the completed form before signing and retain a copy of the completed form for their records.

VA and FCC make it easier for Veterans to get internet access

If you receive a qualifying VA pension, VA and the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) are making it easier for you to get connected to the internet.

Qualifying VA pension recipients will now be able to more easily confirm their eligibility to participate in two FCC benefit programs (Lifeline and the Affordable Connectivity Program), often without needing to submit paperwork to the FCC.

This makes it even easier for qualifying Veterans to get discounts on internet and phone services. Certain service providers may also offer a subsidized device, like a laptop or tablet, to qualifying Affordable Connectivity Program participants.

Discounts to help Veterans get online

These FCC programs help people get online. The Lifeline program gives eligible households a discount for internet and phone services. The Affordable Connectivity Program provides eligible households with a monthly discount toward internet service.

They offer a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from a participating provider if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price of the device.

Veterans can sign up for the programs through the FCC National Verifier or by contacting a participating internet service company. Veterans who want assistance signing up for the FCC's programs can get help from their VA care team through a Digital Divide consult.

Other Veterans can also receive benefits

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Along with qualifying VA pension recipients, other Veterans are also eligible for Lifeline and the Affordable Connectivity Program. You can qualify based on your household income or participation in other federal programs, though you may need to submit additional paperwork as part of the application process.

VA can also help you determine your eligibility through your VA care team and a Digital Divide Consult. The Digital Divide Consult helps connect Veterans with Lifeline, the Affordable Connectivity Program, and other programs to help with internet access.

VA has already helped more than 100,000 Veterans across the country through the Digital Divide Consult process.



We have had a landmark and heavy claims year due to the PACT ACT that was signed into law last year. This act has provided VA benefits to Veterans and surviving spouses that thought they would never get anything. It has been met with much emotion as many VA decisions have been positive and we are so proud of this and the work we are fortunate enough to do. If you feel you are eligible for benefits under this new law, please give us a call and schedule an appointment for us to go over it with you.

Outstanding Volunteer Service Military Medal & Military Ribbon



A. Authorization. E.O. 12830 of 9 January 1993.

B. Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal Eligibility Requirements. The Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) may be awarded to members of the Armed Forces of the United States who, after 31 December 1992, perform outstanding volunteer community service of a sustained, direct and consequential nature. To be eligible, an individual's service must:

(1) Be to the civilian community, including the military family community;

- (2) Be significant in nature and produce tangible results;
- (3) Reflect favorably on the Military Service and the Department of Defense; and
- (4) Be of a sustained and direct nature.
- C. Guidelines

(1) While there is no specific time period to qualify for the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM), approval authorities shall ensure the service to be honored merits the special recognition afforded by the medal. DON views the sustained time period to be three years. The Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) is intended to recognize exceptional community support. Over time, not a single act or achievement. Further, it is intended to honor direct support of community activities. For the purpose of this award, attending membership meetings or social events of a community service group is not considered qualifying service; however, manning a community crisis action telephone line for a sustained period of time is considered qualifying service. The overall level of volunteer participation and impact of an individual's community service is the key to determining whether award of the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) is justified.

(2) The Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) recognizes service provided to a community over time; therefore multiple awards of the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) during a single tour of duty are not authorized. However, approval authorities may consider a sustained record of significant community service performed during successive tours when adjudicating recommendations for award of the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM).

(3) Service recognized by award of the Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) shall be of a voluntary nature, not detailed or tasked, nor performed as part of a military mission (for example, a unit project).

(4) Volunteering with the following types of organizations are examples of qualifying service: youth programs such as Boy/Girl Scouts; YMCA or YWCA; 4H; Big Brothers/Sisters; sports programs such as Little League and Special Olympics; abuse/rape/suicide hot line volunteers; hospital/blood drive volunteers; education programs such as volunteer teachers, D.A.R.E., and literacy programs; CFC organizations such as March of Dimes, Make-a-Wish Foundation, Salvation Army; volunteer fire department/rescue squad; community centers; neighborhood watch; Meals-on-Wheels; homeless shelters; senior citizens1 programs; working with the hearing impaired; fund drives and telethon support; public library story hour; museum guide; local beautification projects such as Adopt-a-Park and Adopt-a- Highway; military affiliates such as USO, Navy and Marine Corps Relief Society, and Navy League' Sea Cadet programs.

(5) An Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal (MOVSM) recommendation may be submitted by anyone senior to the individual being recommended, on the appropriate personal award recommendation form, to the individual's commanding officer. The commanding officer shall certify that the eligibility requirements have been met, and that the member's service has been honorable throughout the award period. Service Medal (MOVSM) is delegated to officers

d. Awarding Authority. Authority to award the Outstanding Volunteer who have authority to award the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal or Joint Service Achievement Medal and above. The awarding authority shall issue a letter of authorization which includes the period recognized and the organization(s) for whom the qualifying service was performed, as well as any commendatory remarks desired by the awarding authority. For Navy personnel, copies of the approved OPNAV 1650/3 will be forwarded to NPC (PERS-312). For Marine Corps personnel, a copy of the approved Award Processing System award recommendation will automatically be forwarded to MMSB for inclusion in ³ the Marine's official military record. No citation or certificate will be issued.

VHA-Uber Health Connect expands Veterans' access to transportation

Transportation remains one of the greatest barriers to increasing Veterans' access to health care. Veterans may face a wide range of transportation challenges ranging from not having access to transportation to relying on a caregiver who may be unavailable or to needing a long-distance drive to their nearest VA.

Following a successful pilot at 10 VA medical centers in 2022, the VHA-Uber Health Connect (VUHC) Initiative is now expanding to 60 new VAMCs to continue addressing this challenge. Eligible Veterans in 18 states and Puerto Rico will have access to supplemental transportation to and from their medical care, expanding access to the soonest and best care. The program proved a success with more than 32,000 rides completed across over 450,000 miles. Survey feedback from 2,300 participants shows that 83% of Veterans would not have been able to access their medical care without the VUHC program.

Since expanding in April 2023, VA staff have been eager to offer the program as another means of transportation for eligible Veterans. From April to June 2023, VUHC completed more than 5,700 rides, making an immediate and tangible impact on Veterans' access to care. As the program expands, more Veterans across the country will have increased access to reliable transportation and fewer barriers to care.

Eligibility requirements for Uber transports are the same as for Special Mode Transportation (SMT) - with the exception that the Veteran must be ambulatory and not require assistance ambulating. One of the following will quality the Veteran:

- 1) Service-connected disability of 30% or more for transport to any VAMC appointment or VA authorized community-care appointment
- 2) Service-connected disability of less than 30% qualifies for transport only to service-connected appointments
- 3) Receives a VA pension
- 4) Receives VA Aid and Attendance
- 5) Income is below the national pension level

If eligible, to arrange the transport, the Veteran needs to contact his social worker or provider to request a BT Common Carrier Consult and specify the date, time, and place of the appointment for which he is requesting transportation. Once the consult has been entered, the SMT staff will be notified and set up the transport. Please know that scheduling an Uber transport does not necessarily ensure that the Veteran will be transported since it is dependent upon driver availability.

<u>2023's Best and Worst States for Military Retirees</u>

As military personnel retire, whether they faced active combat or not, they may find it difficult to readjust to civilian life. Many retirees face major struggles including Posttraumatic Stress Disorder, disability and homelessness, which are especially difficult to deal with during this period of economic difficulty. These Veterans must also consider how state tax policies on military benefits vary, along with the relative friendliness of different job markets and other socioeconomic factors, when choosing a state in which to settle down.

In order to help ease the burden on our nation's military community, WalletHub compared the 50 states and the District of Columbia based on their ability to provide a comfortable military retirement. Our analysis uses a data set of 28 key metrics, ranging from Veterans per capita to number of VA health facilities to job opportunities for Veterans.

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
