C&MPAIGN MED&L

The Kosovo Campaign Medal was established by Executive Order 13154 signed by President William J. Clinton on 03 May 2000. It may be awarded to Navy and Marine Corps personnel for participating in prescribed operations, campaigns and task forces ranging in dates from 24 March 1999 to present.

The area of operations for these various campaigns includes the total land area and air space of Serbia (including Kosovo), Montenegro, Albania, Macedonia, and the waters and air space of the Adriatic Sea within 12 nautical miles of the Montenegro, Albania, and Croatia coastlines south of 42 degrees and 52 minutes North latitude.

Personnel must be members of a unit participating in, or be engaged in direct support of, the operation for 30 consecutive days in the area of operations or for 60 non-consecutive days provided this support involves entering the area of operations or meets one of the following criteria:

Be engaged in actual combat, or duty that is equally as hazardous as combat duty, during the operation with armed opposition, regardless of time in the area of operations; While participating in the operation, regardless of time, is wounded or injured and requires medical evacuation from the area of operations; While participating as a regularly assigned aircrew member flying sorties into, out of, within, or over the area of operations in direct support of the military operations.

One bronze service star shall be worn on the ribbon for qualifying participation during an established campaigns. However, that if an individual's 30 or 60 days began in one campaign and carried over into another, that person would only qualify for the medal with one service star. The medal is not awarded without at least one service star.

The executive order provides that service members who qualify for either the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal or the Armed Forces Service Medal for service in Kosovo between 24 March 1999 and 01 May 2000, remain qualified for those medals. However, upon application, any such member may be awarded the Kosovo Campaign Medal in lieu of the Armed Forces Expeditionary medal or the Armed Forces Service Medal, but no Service member may be awarded more than one of these three medals for the same period of service in Kosovo.

The stylized wreath of grain at the base of the obverse reflects the agricultural character of the area and its economy and symbolizes basic human rights while highlighting the desire of all for peace, safety and prosperity. The rocky terrain, fertile valley, and mountain pass refer to the Dinartic Alps and the campaign's theater of operations. The sunrise denotes the dawning of a new age of unity and hope, the right to forge a future of freedom, progress, and harmony; thus fulfilling the goal of the NATO alliance.

The suspension ribbon's red, white, and blue colors were suggested by the NATO alliance's colors, and the red, white, and blue central pinstripes represent the colors of the United States flag.

SC Housing's homebuyer program honors 'Palmetto Heroes' with \$10,000 in down payment assistance and low interest rates.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (April 13, 2023) – The goal of homeownership can be challenging for many South Carolinians as home prices and interest rates continue to rise.

SC Housing is bringing back the Palmetto Heroes Program on Monday, April 17 to help South Carolina residents who serve their communities achieve the dream of homeownership with down payment assistance and below market rate home loans.

The Palmetto Heroes Program recognizes designated community service personnel, such as first-responders, teachers, and more, who provide vital support to their community. This year, the 2023 Palmetto Heroes program will assist qualifying South Carolina teachers, nurses, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, fire fighters, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, Veterans, active duty military, and SC guard members.

Eligible Palmetto Heroes homebuyers can get a low, fixed-rate mortgage through SC Housing's First-time Homebuyer Program, as well as \$10,000 in forgivable down payment assistance.

"There's nothing that helps create generational wealth quite like homeownership and the Palmetto Heroes Program is one of our state's best measures for helping our state's heroes do that," Steve Clements, director of SC Housing's single-family programs said. "We're proud to provide this program and help families attain this goal."

The program will be on available April 17 on a first-come, first-served basis, and borrowers must have an executed sales contract on a home. Mortgage loans are for 30 years and are available through any of SC Housing's network of more than 100 participating lenders statewide. Borrower(s) must meet SC Housing's first-time homebuyer requirements, as well as income requirements based on location and household size. The program may not be used for refinancing.

Each year, the program is in high demand and loan reservations are typically exhausted within a few months. 

All that is required is standard telephone service and a high-speed internet connection. The captioned telephone service is available at no cost and can be accessed 24/7, nationwide.

The Veteran's hearing loss does not have to be service-related. Fast, accurate captions on every call with advanced voice recognition software is used to process calls and as necessary, a live Captioning Assistant (CA) generates captions of what is said. Every call is 100% confidential - All calls remain strictly confidential. As required by law, Hamilton CapTel is NOT permitted to disclose information or retain any records, documents or recordings of any conversation.

You can also contact a Veterans Service Organization to assist with your claim.



All enrolled veterans will be offered this brief screen to document your concerns as part of your health record. Screening can be performed by your Primary Care provider during your scheduled primary care appointment. To obtain a primary care appointment, please contact the Atlanta VA Health Care System Call Center at 404-329-2222 or reach out to your primary care provider on MyHealthEVet.



TALK TO YOUR HEALTH PROVIDER Review your medical concerns and share any symptoms or additional information with your healthcare provider that you feel may be related to an environmental exposure. This is the best way to be proactive in addressing your healthcare needs and long-term goals with exposure-informed care. SIGN UP FOR A REGISTRY EXAM VA's Environmental health registry evaluation is a free, voluntary medical assessment for Veterans who may have been exposed to certain environmental hazards during military service. The evaluations alert Veterans to possible long-term health problems that may be related to exposure to specific environmental hazards during their military service. The registry evaluation is separate from VA's disability compensation process and is not required to file a disability claim. VA has six registries: Agent Orange, Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pits, Depleted Uranium, Gulf War, Ionizing Radiation, and Toxic Embedded Fragments. Disabled Veterans Equal Access Act 2018

DISABLED VETERANS EQUAL ACCESS ACT 2018

In January 2020 we received new Department of Defense/Army Regulations which expand authorized use at AFRC Resorts to Purple Heart recipients, former prisoners of war (POW), Veterans with VA-documented service-connected disability ratings and Primary Family Caregivers of eligible Veterans under the VA Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers.

This expanded authorization currently does not include the Edelweiss Lodge and Resort or Dragon Hill Lodge. The new law is subject to the limitations of applicable host nation law and international agreements that have not been resolved. If there is a change in policy we will update our website and social media pages.

Below are the quidelines for the new authorized users at Hale Koa Hotel and the Shades of Green Resort:

Veterans who are Purple Heart recipients, Veterans who are former POWs, all Veterans with VA-documented service-connected disability ratings, and individuals assessed, approved, and designated as the Primary Family Caregivers of eligible Veterans under the VA Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers are eligible Shades of Green Resort users when identified as follows:

Veterans must present a Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) indicating at least one of the three acceptable eligibility statuses (PURPLE HEART, FORMER POW, or SERVICE CONNECTED); or HEC form H623A indicating placement in VA health care priority group 8E paired with an acceptable credential like a REAL ID-compliant State driver's license or a U.S. passport.


Note: VHICs are issued to Veterans enrolled in VA health care. Visit: https://www.va.gov/healthbenefits/vhic/ for information regarding eligibility for the VHIC and the application process.

Primary Family Caregivers must present their letter from the VA Office of Community Care that indicates they are assessed, approved, and designated Primary Family Caregiver of an eligible Veteran under the Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers and are eligible for these privileges paired with an acceptable credential like a REAL ID-compliant state driver's license or a U.S. passport.
